

Instructions for using 415 Wiki

This wiki is only visible to members of the class. Your changes to the wiki will be recorded with your netid (i.e. they are not anonymous). Just as you are in class, please be considerate of your colleagues' work and feelings in this on-line setting.

1. Point your browser at <https://confluence.cornell.edu/display/INFO415/Home>
2. Login using your netid and usual CIT password. This will put you on our main page.
 - a. If you do not have permission to see the home page, please email the instructor with your netid at [sengers @ cs.cornell.edu](mailto:sengers@cs.cornell.edu).
3. To see all the pages available from here, click on "children."
4. To edit the page, select "Page Operations" on the left hand menu and then click on "Edit Page." This will open an editor in the browser allowing you to change the page content.
5. You are free to add pages to the wiki for any course-related functionality. You can do so by selecting "add content" on the left-hand menu and clicking on "add page".
6. The wiki has an official "comment" functionality, but this adds comments to an entire page rather than one piece of it. You are certainly welcome to use the comment functionality, but when we speak of "commenting" on other people's posts, this means adding a bullet point underneath it and putting your reactions there. **Please label your comments with your name.**
7. In order to be aware of what is going on on the wiki without having to visit it just to check for updates, I strongly urge you to add an email watch to the wiki. You do this as follows:
 - a. Go to the main page of the wiki
 - b. Click on "Browse space" in the left hand menu
 - c. Under "Subscribe", click "Start watching this space."
 - d. [Note: I have not been able to get the RSS feeds to work, but if you have luck with this, please let us know how to do it!]

Note: This is the first time I am using Confluence software to support a course wiki. Your feedback on how well the software works for the course is welcome.
