





What framing does is to "select some aspects of a perceived reality and make them more salient in a communicating text, in such a way as to promote a particular problem definition, causal interpretation, moral evaluation, and/or treatment recommendation for the item described."

**Semantic** ratings: averaged across 18 subjects

Strong correlations

- Volition: r = -.78

– Sentience: r = -.76

- Kinesis/movement: r = -.75





"The ability to change topical focus, especially given strong cultural and social pressure to be relevant, means having enough interpersonal power to take charge of the agenda."

For every document, For every word topics that will be for that word. used.

pick the mixture of position, pick a topic

Generate a word associated with that topic.

For every turn in the conversation, we know who the author is and what words they used.

For this new turn, we decide whether to keep the old mix of topics, or generate a new mix.

That choice depends on the author of this new turn and their tendency to change the topic.


We have some mix of topics from the previous turn.









"What your plan does is to duplicate what's already the law, which says if you are out of health insurance for three months, then you can end up getting continuous coverage and an insurance company can't deny you if you've -- if it's been under 90 days. But that's already the law."

As the figure shows, the statement received much agreement and little disagreement from Democratic viewers.

Surprisingly, however, Republicans were roughly divided in their reactions, registering almost as much agreement as disagreement—an uncommonly positive net engagement for Obama among Republicans in our data.
