


Issues are multi-dimensional

Issue Framing







We Also Track for Tone (Pro/Anti/Neutral)

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- Explicit Arguments: opinions expressed directly in support for one side of the issue at hand
 - smokers have rights that need to be respected (pro smoking)
 - taxes on tobacco sales are a good idea (anti smoking)

We Also Track for Tone (Pro/Anti/Neutral)

- **Explicit** Arguments: opinions expressed directly in support for one side of the issue at hand
 - smokers have rights that need to be respected (pro smoking)
 - taxes on tobacco sales are a good idea (anti smoking)
- Implicit Cues: information that reflects positively or negatively on one side of the issue at hand
 - tobacco company provides jobs for local community (pro)
 - new study links smoking to additional forms of cancer (anti)




- Five issues (in the United States):





Pilot Data


- 1990–2012
- Smoking/tobacco
 - Sampled N = 2,927 stories (emphasis)
- Immigration
 - Sampled N = 3,004 stories (emphasis)
 - = 376 stories (tone)


Pilot Test Goals

- Emphasis
 - Are the unified frame dimensions applicable across issues?
 - Do we see frames not covered in our unified coding scheme?
- Tone











Immigration: Tone


pro-immigration stories
