

Computer Science Graduate Student TA Instructor /Co-Instructor Application

- **Principle:** A senior Phd student who is planning on a career as a lecturer or as a faculty member in a teaching-focused college/university, may apply (link to application) to the department to be assigned as a student co-instructor or TA instructor in an undergraduate course (1XXX-4XXX), instructor for project courses, short courses during the academic year or an instructor for summer courses.
- We offer a variety of different opportunities for getting teaching experience, which includes the associated evaluations from students.
- **Co-instructor:** the student becomes an equal partner in teaching a large undergraduate course with a faculty member. The student will teach at least 1/3 of the lectures, or be in charge of the project course part of a large course with a project component. See appointment process below. The students in the course will be asked to fill out separate course evaluations on the two instructors.
- **TA-instructor:** similar to co-instructor, but at a lower level of commitment. The student is appointed as a TA, with additional commitment, expected to work 20 hours/week (rather than the 15 for TAs). Some of the duties will involve lecturing and course design, and students in the course will be asked to fill out separate course evaluations on the instructors and a TA-instructor. Appointment will be compensated for 20 hours/week.
- **Short courses:** student will be the sole instructor of a short small credit course (teaching a programming language, unix or other tools). See appointment process on page 2. The students in the course fill out course evaluations on the instructor.
- **Summer course:** student will be the sole instructor of a course offered in the 6 week summer teaching session. See appointment process below.
- **Approvals;** All applications will be shared with the Chair's office for final approval dependent on teaching availability and need.

Appointment Process: Student will submit an application to the CS Graduate Office on the following timelines to be considered:

- Fall courses, no later than January 1st
- Spring courses, no later than August 1st
- Summer courses, no later than December 1st.
